



#### From The Revd Lin Francis

June 2023

#### Dear Friends,

Geoff and I have discovered The Bakery at West Camel on the A 303. All bakeries are like heaven on earth to my Geoff; the smell of freshly baked bread, the variety of cakes and savouries and the wide choice of sandwiches they prepare is a joy to behold.

With the summer holidays coming up we will go into the shop and buy Lardy Cake to take to our friends in Cornwall as has become our custom. Our friends also shop their when they travel up this way to family, so we have a mutual love of bread and lardy cake. Despite the economic crisis we are struggling with aren't we all very fortunate that we can choose a variety of food to eat, we are in plentiful supply of any food stuff we want and malnutrition is not an every day occurrence for us. We are fortunate, or are we?

There is malnutrition in this land, a very different sort of malnutrition. When the word of God is neglected we suffer from spiritual malnutrition. Liz Babbs in her book 'Into God's Presence' talks of The Word of God being our food. She reminds readers that the Bible calls it our milk, bread, solid food and sweet dessert. God's Word is not an optional extra – the side order, it is a vital necessity. She suggests that we savour on the scriptures, meditate on them just like a four course meal. Here are some of her examples:

#### Milk

- Like newborn babies you should crave (thirst for, earnestly desire) the pure (unadulterated) spiritual milk, that by it you may be nurtured and grow unto [completed] salvation. (1 Peter 2:2 AMP)
- In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's Word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! (Hebrews 5:12 TNIV)

#### Bread

- It is written: 'Man does not live by bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.' (Matthew 4:4)
- I have treasured the words of his mouth more than my daily bread. (Job 23:12)
- Then the Lord said to Moses, 'I will rain down bread from heaven for you. The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day. In this way I will test them and see whether they will follow my instructions.' (Exodus 16:4)

- Keep falsehood and lies far from me; give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. (Proverbs 30:8)
- While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take and eat; this is my body.' (Matthew 26:26)
- 'My food,' said Jesus, 'is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work.' (John 4:34)

#### Solid Food

- I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, you are still not ready. (1 Corinthians 3:2)
- But solid food is for full-grown men, for those whose senses and mental faculties are trained by practice to discriminate and distinguish between what is morally good and noble and what is evil and contrary either to ivine or human law. (Hebrews 5:14)

#### **Sweet Dessert**

- How sweet are Your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!
   (Psalm 119:103)
- Eat honey, my son, for it is good; honey from the comb is sweet to your taste. Know also that wisdom is sweet to your soul; if you find it, there is a future hope for you, and your hope will not be cut off. (Proverbs 24:13-14)

These are definitely words for spiritual feeding. Chew them over, digest and absorb them and may this food be the fuel for our Christian lives. Enjoy the summer and all the feeding it offers you.




