

From The Revd Lin Francis

Dear Friends,

'Go and make disciples of all nations...' Matt 28:19a

In our last Bridge Magazine, I wrote about the ending of this Y&BV Circuit as we know it and I talked about how Jesus prepared people for change and of how he promised his disciples that he would give them another Counsellor to be with them, the Spirit of truth. Jesus did not leave his friends, nor leaves us to struggle with our Christian lives alone. The Holy Spirit is someone who is called on to help in times of trouble or need.

Endings and New Beginnings are difficult. They are also necessary. Without change there is no growth, no development, just a stagnant situation. So far from massive sorrow and lamenting about the changes we are embarking on, there should also be a celebration of how we might grow in faith, in life through the experiences which will come to us.

There is no new life without death. We need to remember Good Friday and Easter. We couldn't truly celebrate Easter Sunday without experiencing the emotions of Good Friday. The disciples journeyed with a Master who had set his face to go to Jerusalem. They had heard him say he would be handed over, mocked, flogged, and crucified, but that on the third day Jesus will be raised from the dead. On Easter Sunday morning they were awestruck. They had failed to understand him – but now it was true. The consequence of Easter morning, for both the disciples and us, is that the journey is by no means over, there is more travelling to do.

In one sense, the journey to Jerusalem has no end, because at Jerusalem it led, not to completion, but to commission, as we read in Matt 28. Jesus called the disciples three years earlier; and yet now the disciples are going out, into the vast, antagonistic, sceptical, suspicious world of the first century.

Travel onwards with him. He will guide you, direct you and strengthen you and be travelling with you. Be prepared to be surprised at how this next chapter enfolds.

As the various churches move on into new Circuits, we think of them as they tread uncharted waters. We say thank you to them for their friendship, fellowship and hospitality on many occasions,





The Pod has just won a national award! We were Highly Commended by The United Reformed Church "Community Project Award" and will receive £1000! I travelled on Saturday, with my husband Richard who is a Pod Volunteer, to the URC General Assembly at Swanwick in Derbyshire, where we were presented with a special award plaque which we will soon have on

display! There is also a video of our project, with the other award winners, on the URC website, along with a photo of us all together. The Head of Communications, who came to visit us in May, was really impressed with just how many different things we are doing at The Pod, in quite a small space!

To date we have been visited over 11,000 times. As you know, our visitors come in for all sorts of reasons. Some bring in knitted items (4450 so far!) and other donations for refugee support or fundraising. I recently learned that a Ukrainian family settling in the town urgently needed a bed settee, and before I had chance to even ask around, a couple came in to The Pod offering the perfect item, exactly what they wanted! This is the sort of thing that happens at The Pod. It is wonderful to be able to be a link between community needs and community generosity. I believe God is involved in the timing!

We have now raised over £4000 for the Yeovil Breast Cancer Unit from the jewellery in the window, and I know thousands more have been raised at auction with the more expensive items donated at The Pod. We have also raised over £4000 for other charities, focusing currently on The Air Ambulance.

Many love that we have Christian Books on offer, and about 600 have been taken so far, as well as over 560 free Bibles!

The visitors to our emergency food shelf are very grateful for that extra bit
